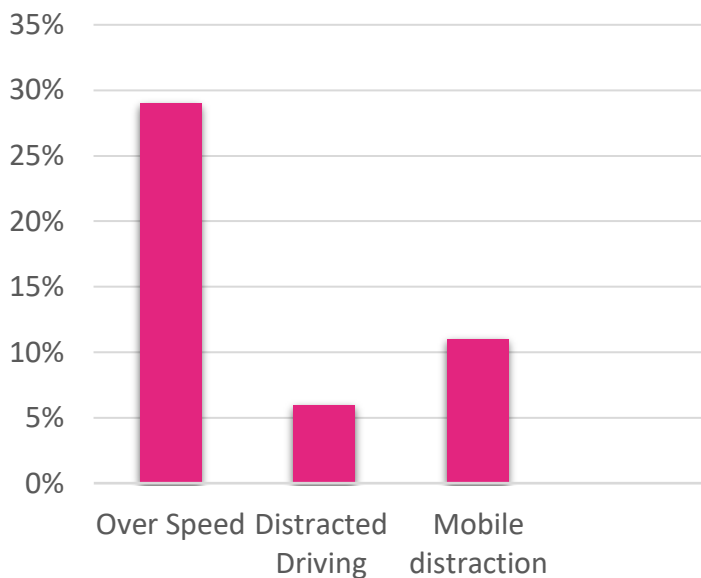
Defensive Driving

Accident Statistics and Causes:



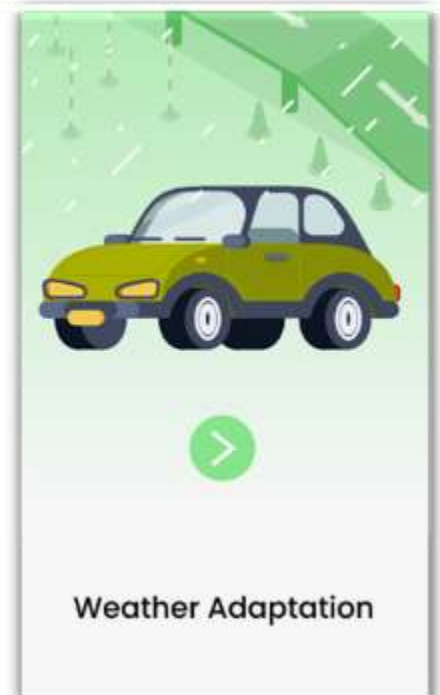
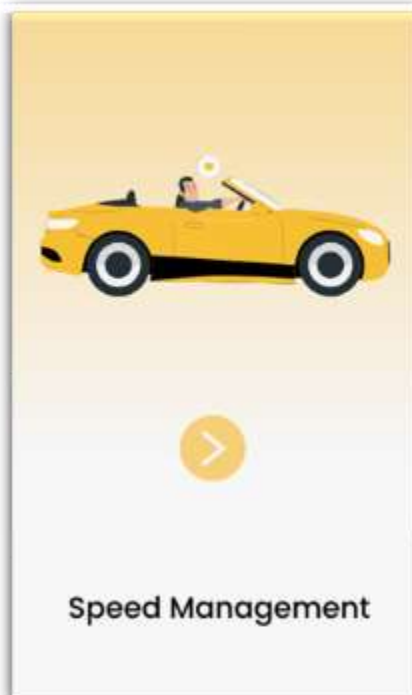
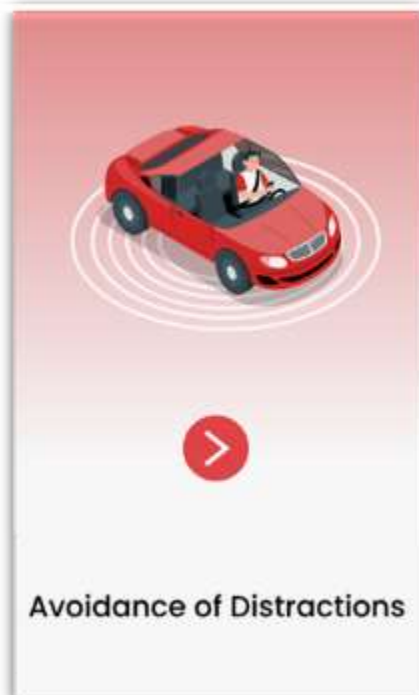
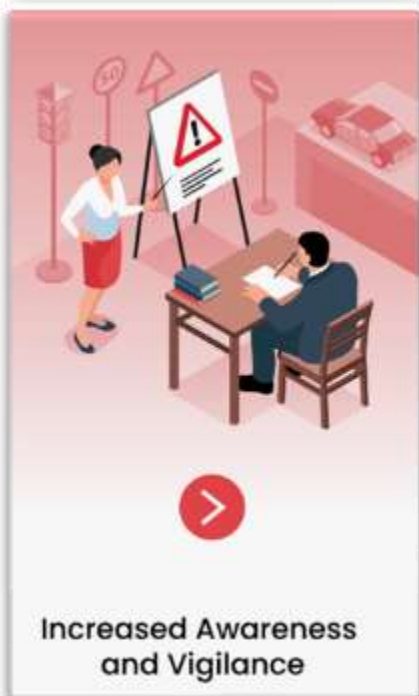
